NAPA COUNTY SUPERVISOR DIANE DILLON ENDORSES RYAN GREGORY FOR SUPERVISOR; ENDORSEMENT SECURES MAJORITY SUPPORT FROM OUTGOING AND INCOMING BOARDS OF SUPERVISORS

Napa, CA – Napa County Supervisor Diane Dillon announced today she's endorsing Ryan Gregory for Napa County Supervisor.

The endorsement represents a majority of the outgoing and incoming Boards of Supervisors, and has created unprecedented momentum for Gregory, who is making his first bid for public office. Dillon joins Supervisors Alfredo Pedroza and Keith Caldwell in supporting Gregory as part of the outgoing Board of Supervisors, and Dillon's endorsement also reflects the majority of the 2017 Board of Supervisors made up of Dillon, Pedroza and Belia Ramos, who is succeeding Caldwell in January. Other local elected officials from U.S. Congressman Mike Thompson (D-St. Helena) to the entire Napa City Council (Mayor Jill Techel, Vice Mayor Mary Luros, Council Member Juliana Inman, Council Member Pete Mott and Council Member Scott Sedgley) have joined Supervisors Dillon, Pedroza, Caldwell and Supervisor-Elect Ramos in supporting Gregory's campaign.

Gregory was energized by the latest endorsement, stating, "Supervisor Dillon has been a fierce and tireless advocate for preserving the Ag Preserve, protecting our environment and open space areas, and putting our residents first. I am thrilled to have the support of such a distinguished public servant in Napa County, and I look forward to working with her to get things done on the Board of Supervisors. As a lifelong Napa County resident, I cannot recall another race where a Board of Supervisors majority backed a challenger over their colleague, so this is a monumental day for our campaign, and I'm ready to work harder than ever to ensure our success in November. It's clear that our call for change is reverberating across Napa County, from voters' doorsteps to the Napa City Council to the Board of Supervisors. Heading into the home stretch, we stand united and know it's time for new leadership for 2nd District residents on the Board of Supervisors."

Ryan Gregory finished with 41.5% of the vote in the four-person June primary. The 2nd Supervisorial District encompasses much of western Napa, including parts of Browns Valley and downtown Napa, as well as unincorporated areas west of Napa stretching to the Sonoma-Napa County line.
